CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING

We are aware that providing financial services alone will not make someone self-reliant. If we consider the financial assistance provided to literate and less educated women and man as hardware automatically one has to get software commands at the backend to facilitate a smooth work flow. Hence we have provided various types of trainings to these folks. Some of the major training are on SHG concepts, SHG book writing, Social awareness and sensitization, reproductive health training, family planning, financial literacy which includes dealing with bank, money transactions, credit linkages with financial institutions, stitching & tailoring, zory work training, food processing etc







OBSERVATION & CELEBRATION OF THE IMPORTANT DAYS

• 9th May: Rabindra Jayanti

Rabindra Jayanti, the birth of Rabindranath Tagore(Biswa Kabi), celebrated by the Members of this Sangha. With a view to motivate the children and local people organized competition on recitation, dances, songs and drama.

• 11th July: World Women's Day

Organized a seminar only for Women about their Rights and Duties. The Headmistress of local Girls' School presided over the Seminar. She delivered a speech regarding the Rights and Duties of the Women. She also awarded them about them about the bad effect of Dowry- System.

• 5th. June: World Environmental Day

Organized a road- show with banners and festoons to aware the local people regarding pollution of the environment. Lecture also organized on the topic delivered By Gram Pradhan & Respectable Teacher of the locality.

15th. August: Independence Day

Organized with flag -march by the Members of the Sangha accompanied with local student& and villagers stared at early in the morning and ended at 11:00 A.M. of the day. Slogan on the prominent freedom Fighters are given to remember them at end of the procession, organized lectures in respect of famous freedom Fighters who have scarified their lives for the freedom of our country.

• 29th August: National Sports Day

Organized various sports and games specially Volley Ball & Foot Ball competition. 10 to 12 teams participated from various places for both games. Prizes are distributed to the winner's teams.

• 5th September: Teacher's Day (Birth Day of Sarbapally Radhakrishnan)

This day is observed as Teacher's Day by holding a meeting. About 30 to 40 teachers attend the meeting. Prominent teacher's of some schools delivered heart rendering speech regarding life history of Dr. Radhakrishnan, a greatest philosopher of India to motivate the teachers & young educated youth of the locality.

• 29th September: Birth Day of Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar

This day of observed every year by organizing a meeting for 3 to 4 hours. Local young educated men & Women attended the meeting. The reputated teacher of the locality discussed the life- history of Vidyasagar with a view to build up our character as like as him.

• 2nd October: Birth Day of Mahatma Gandhi

Birth Day of the Father of Nation (Mahatma Gandhi) a great political leader of freedom movement of India, observed with speeches delivered by some prominent persons of the locality to recollect the life of Gandhiji for 4 to 5 hours.

14th November: Birth Day of Jaharlal Nehru

This day observed as Children's Day. Pupils of the local Primary, High and Higher Secondary School along with the villagers and the Members of the Sangha march-passed With National flags. On the occasions of Independence Day various sports and games were arranged. More than 130 numbers of boys and girls participated. Prizes were given to the successful competitors.






Ashadip Medical, Sports, cultural and Science fare::

HEAL TH CLINIC

A Homeopathic Clinic is running where a Doctor attend the patients regularly. Free medical checkup and free medicines are provided to the beneficiaries.897 patients benefited from the Homeopathy clinic 29 Eye screening camps conducted during the year in nearly 30 villages. Out of 1855 patients attended, 103 were operated upon the cataract.





Animal vaccination and treatment and free medicine camp:

6 Veterinary vaccination, treatment and free medicine distribution camps conducted during the year in nearly 10 villages. Out of 920 cows and goats attended, 710 were vaccinated for FMD and HSBQ infection.





SHGs Programme

five groups are running properly. At least 50(fifty) women are depositing their premium regularly and they are likely to be self sufficient with this programme.





Awareness Camp:

At the end of every month, awareness camp for women on the various aspects is being conveyed and contemporary issues.



Social Forestry:

To avoid natural calamities and environment pollution the Sangha executed some programmes to build up the awareness. The village roads have been cleaned about various types of saplings have been planted by the sides of the village roads.

Distribution Books and Sports Items:

Text Books free of cost have been distribution to 15 numbers of poor students on the occasion of $15^{\rm th}$ August.





Blood Donation Camp:

A Blood Donation Camp was organized on 23rd May 2013. 30(Thirty) persons donated blood in the camp.

In addition the members of our Association assist to local administration in connection with the opening of small Savings Account, preparation of job card, arrangement to get Krishi-Loan etc.
